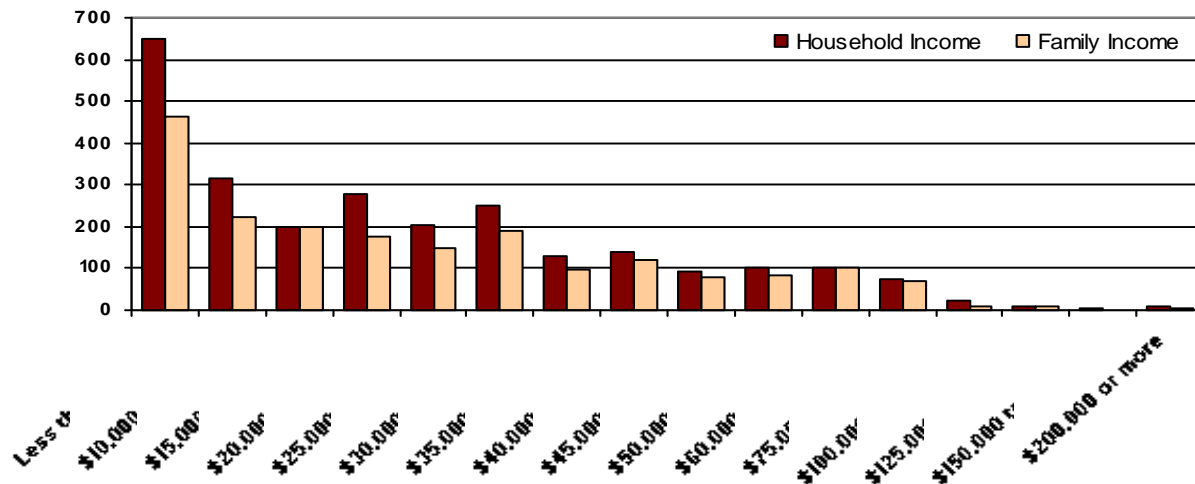

- Worked in their own business, profession, or farm
- Worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers in a family owned enterprise

Unemployment definition:

- Have not worked during monthly survey period
- Available for work
- Actively seeking a job during last four weeks

Unemployment Rate definition:

- Equal to the number of Unemployed divided by number in the Labor Force
